PRESENT RECORD LOCATIONS: Church of Ireland burial registers 1712-1916 are at the Representative Church Body Library.

We have amalgamated the work of Rev. Beaver Blacker, Danny Parkinson and also the work of a group of people who worked as part of a Youth Employment Scheme in transcribing the inscriptions of Donnybrook Graveyard. The notes from the scheme survive (in part) on a notice board just inside the gate of the cemetery. A full copy of the original has not been found to-date.
